UNDISPUTED FACTS

Jamie (45) and Cersei (41) entered into a love marriage and had lived as husband and wife for approximately 24 years. During the later parts of their marriage, Jamie suffered from chronic alcoholism. These conditions led to his frequent unemployment and the pledging of family jewelry to fund his addiction. Following a quarrel, Cersei left Jamie and began residing with her parents and her daughter, Myrcella. She subsequently took a job at a garment factory to eke out a living. Following the separation, the parties continued to reside in separate homes and interactions between their respective families remained very occasional only to the matters concerning their daughter.

Disagreements relating to the marriage continued to be a matter of discussion among the families and the neighborhood. However, Cersei focused largely on her career and her only daughter. Owing to circumstances, aspects of her personal life, now and then, became the subject of discussion and unsolicited interest among members of the locality. As a woman living independently following a prolonged separation, she became a recognizable person within the locality and travelled to and from through the same route on most of the working days.

On April 3, 2026, at approximately 9:30 PM, Cersei was returning home from work. After she got down from the bus at Dorne Bypass Road, she was stopped. Two witnesses, Browne Mani and Telex Pandian, observed the encounter. They saw a man strike Cersei several times on the head with a wooden log whom they identify to be Jamie. When the witnesses shouted and ran towards Cersei, they observed the man drop the log and flee from the scene.

Immediately after the attack, Browne Mani and Telex Pandian notified Cersei's other relatives of the incident. Cersei was transported to the local Government Hospital, where she died at 11:00 PM that night.

On the morning of April 4, 2026, at 5:00 AM, Cersei's father Tywin went to the local police station and filed a formal complaint. Based on this statement, Investigating Officer, one Mr. Ace Ventura registered an FIR in Crime No. 26/2026 under Sections 126 (Wrongful Restraint) and 103 (Murder) of the Baratheon Nyaya Sanhita (hereinafter referred to as the "BNS").

Later that day, the accused was arrested at 1:30 PM. Following the arrest, his confession was recorded at 3:00 PM in the presence of the Village Administrative Officer (VAO) and the Village Assistant. Pursuant to his confession, the police recovered a blood-stained wooden log and a shirt.

The Gist of the First Information Report is hereby submitted: Today (i.e.) on 04.04.2026, at about 05.00 A.M., when I, **Ace Ventura**, the Inspector of Kuninjipadi Rural Police Station, was present at the station, the informant, **Mr. Tywin**, S/o Manick Baasha, aged 65 years, residing at House No. 106, Elder Estate, 11th Main Road, Shadow Glen District, Kuninjipadi, Neverland – 600040, appeared before the station and gave a complaint regarding the fatal assault on his daughter, **Mrs. Cersei**, residing at House No. 106, Elder Estate, 11th Main Road, Shadow Glen District, Kuninjipadi, Neverland – 600040, which is as follows:

"Madam/Sir, my daughter Cersei has been living separately from her husband, Jamie, for two years due to his habitual alcoholism and mental harassment. On April 3, 2026, at approximately 09:30 P.M., as she returned from work at a garment factory and got down at the Dorne Bypass Road, my son in law, Jamie intercepted her. Following a verbal dispute where he questioned about their strained relationship, he struck her repeatedly on the back of the head with a wooden log. The assault was witnessed by Browne Mani

and Telex Pandian. My daughter was rushed to the hospital but succumbed to her injuries at 11:00 P.M. I request that you register this case and take strict action."

A) Details of Parties

State: Inspector of Police, Kuninjipadi Rural Police Station, Kuninjipadi District.

Accused: Jamie, Age 45, S/o. Mark Anthony, Resident of State of Neverland.

B) Nature of Information: On 04-04-2026, at around 05:00 A.M., the complainant Mr. Tywin, S/o Manick Baasha, aged 65 years, occupation Carpenter, appeared at the station and gave a complaint regarding the death of his daughter, Mrs. Cersei. The deceased had been living separately from her husband, the accused Jamie, for two years due to his habitual alcoholism and mental harassment, and was working at a garment factory. On 03-04-2026, at approximately 09:30 P.M., as the deceased returned from work and got down at the Dorne Bypass Road, the accused intercepted her. Following a verbal dispute regarding their strained relationship, the accused struck her repeatedly on the back of her head with a 3-foot wooden log. The act was witnessed by Browne Mani and Telex Pandian. The deceased was rushed to the nearby Government hospital but succumbed to her injuries at 11:00 P.M. the same night. Based on this complaint, a case was registered, and investigation was undertaken.

C) Details of persons acquainted with the facts. The list of witnesses, including the eyewitnesses Browne Mani and Telex Pandian, and the medical officer Dr. Rajaraman, is attached separately herewith.

D) If it appears that any offense has been committed in this case, by whom? How? When? The incident in this case occurred within the jurisdiction of the Kuninjipadi Rural Police Station, at Dorne Bypass Road, Kuninjipadi District. On 03-04-2026, at 09:30 P.M., the accused Jamie, aged 45, with the intention of causing death, wrongfully restrained the deceased Cersei and had repeatedly struck her with a wooden log on her head, causing fatal craniocerebral injuries. The medical report confirms the cause of death as head injuries caused by a blunt object. The act of the accused is an offense punishable under Sections 103(1) (Murder) and 126 (Wrongful Restraint) of BNS. **This is the charge.**

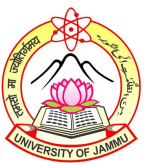

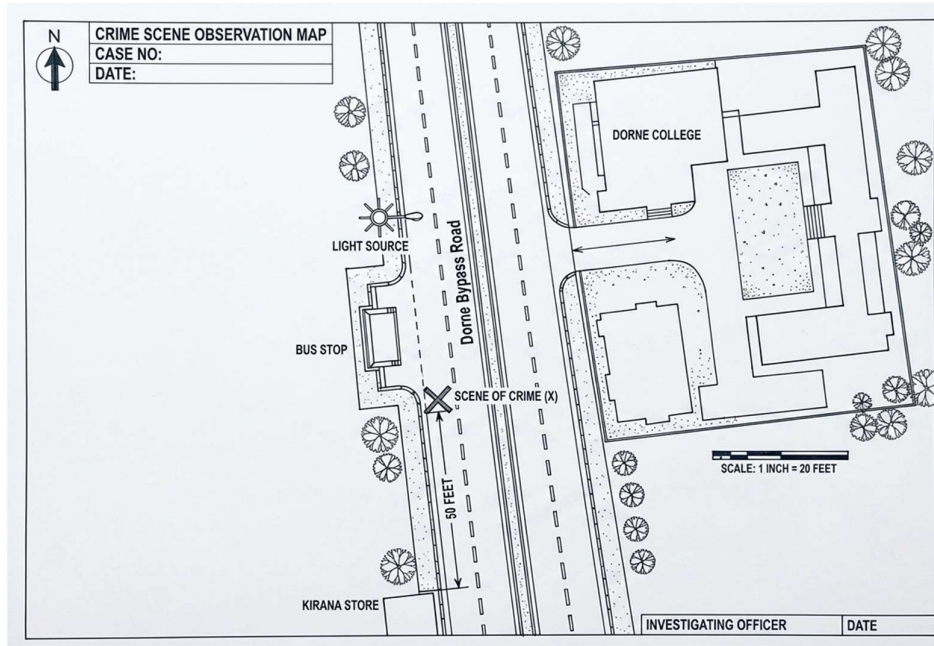

OBSERVATION MAHAZAR



On the 4th day of April 2026, at 07:15 A.M, the scene of crime in Kuninjipadi Rural PS in Cr.No. 26/2026, U/s 103(1) and 126 of BNS, located at Dorne Bypass Road, Kuninjipadi District, was inspected and this Observation Mahazar was prepared by me, Ace Ventura, Inspector of Police, Kuninjipadi Rural PS, in the presence of witnesses:

1. **Mrs. Lily**, W/ A 49, W/o Loter, No. 227, Kulfi Street, Kuninjipadi, and
2. **Mr. Roy**, W/ A 43, S/o Poy, No. 4/56, Rangoliano Road, Kuninjipadi.

The scene of this case is located about 3.0 km south of Kuninjipadi Rural PS. The scene is situated on the western shoulder of the six-lane Dorne Bypass Road, immediately adjacent to the Bus Stop. When viewed facing north from the scene, the scene faces east toward the bypass road. To the south of the scene, at a distance of approximately 50 feet, is a Kirana Store. Opposite the scene, on the eastern side of the six-lane road, is Dorne College. A functional street light source is located just north of the bus stop. Thus, the scene and its surroundings are located.

In the presence of the undermentioned witnesses, I, **Ace Ventura**, Inspector of Police, Kuninjipadi Rural PS, have recorded this Mahazar. Following the arrest of the accused, **Jamie**, and upon recording his voluntary confession statement, the accused disclosed the location where he had concealed the weapon and clothing used during the commission of the offence.

Based on this disclosure, the accused led the investigation team and the witnesses to a secluded spot behind a cluster of rocks located near the **Dorne Bypass Road** crime scene. Under the guidance of the accused, the following items were discovered and recovered:

1. **Blood-Stained Shirt:** One shirt belonging to the accused, heavily stained with a dark brown substance suspected to be blood, found hidden behind the rocks as stated by the accused.
2. **Blood-Stained Wooden Log:** One wooden log, measuring approximately 3 feet in length, also stained with the same suspected blood substance, recovered from the same location.

The aforementioned objects have been seized, packed, and sealed in the presence of the witnesses for forensic chemical analysis.

CONFESSION STATEMENT

Today, April 4, 2026, at 13:30 hrs, I, Ace Ventura, Inspector of Police, Kuninjipadi District, in connection with Station Crime No. 26/2026 under Sections 103 and 126 of the Baratheon Nyaya Sanhita, upon receiving information, secured the accused Jamie (45), S/o Mark Anthony, resident of the State of Neverland, near the regional bus terminal in Kuninjipadi, after he was identified by witnesses. The arrest was made in the presence of the under-signing witnesses:

1. Casino Goval, Village Administrative Officer of the local jurisdiction, and
2. Monica Belluchi, Village Assistant.

Upon inquiry, he admitted to his crime and voluntarily gave the following confession statement without any threat or false promise:

"My name is Jamie. I am 45 years old. I did not go to school and have been earning a living by operating a power loom since my youth. I have had the habit of drinking alcohol and using chewing tobacco since my childhood. Twenty-four years ago, while working at a loom shed, I became acquainted with a girl named Cersei who lived in the house opposite the shed. This acquaintance turned into love, and we eloped. We have one 17-year-old daughter named Myrcella.

I became addicted to alcohol from the beginning of our marriage. I spent the majority of my income on drinking, giving only a small portion to my wife, which led to frequent quarrels. My wife, Cersei, was a leader of a Women's Self-Help Group, and since she handled cash for the members, I would frequently steal that money without her knowledge to fund my addiction. Two years ago, after I took a large sum of money and disappeared for several days to drink, a major quarrel occurred. My wife told me never to come near her again. She took our daughter and settled in an adjacent locality in Neverland near her parents' home, where she began working at a garment factory to support them.

I recently went to see my daughter and gave her money for clothes.

Yesterday, April 3, 2026, knowing she would return from work, I went to the Dorne Bypass Road in the Kuninjipadi district. I hid behind a rock and waited for her arrival. Around 9:00 PM, after Cersei got down from the bus, I approached her with an approximately 3-foot-long wooden log I had hidden behind my back. After a verbal argument where I told her she would never change and to 'get lost,' I struck her repeatedly on the back of the head with the log.



Blood spurted onto the log and my clothing, and she fainted and fell to the ground. Seeing two people, watching me and rushing toward us, were watching me and rushing toward us, I hurriedly removed the wooden log used for the incident and the blood-stained shirt I was wearing I hid them behind a nearby rock and fled the scene when they began chasing me. I stayed at my sister's house for the night, but today, while standing at the bus stand at 1:30 PM planning to flee to another district, I was taken into custody. If you take me to the site, I will produce the blood-stained wooden log the blood-stained shirt used for the incident and show the place of occurrence."

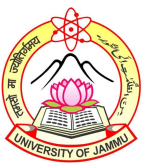

The body was that of a middle-aged female, moderately built and nourished. Rigor mortis was present in all four limbs. Post-mortem lividity was noted on the back, except at pressure points.

III. Schedule of Injuries

The following external injuries were noted on the body:

- **Injury 1:** Multiple lacerated wounds observed in the middle 1/3rd of the left leg. The largest wound measured **1 x 3 x 5 cms**, followed by wounds measuring **0.5 x 2 x 1 cms** and **0.5 x 1 x 1 cms**.
- **Injury 2:** Lacerated wound in the left forehead measuring **0.5 x 1 x 3 cms**.
- **Injury 3:** Lacerated wound in the left frontal region measuring **1 x 2 x 5 cms**.
- **Injury 4:** Lacerated wound in the left parietal region.
- **Injury 5:** Lacerated wound in the left parieto-occipital region measuring **1 x 3 x 6 cms**.
- **Injury 6:** Lacerated wound in the left occipital region measuring **1 x 1 x 3 cms**.
- **Injury 7:** Several additional lacerated injuries noted on the left leg of the deceased.

IV. Internal Examination

- **Cranium & Spinal Canal:** Scalp showed extensive contusion corresponding to external injuries 2 through 6. Fissured fracture noted on the left parietal bone. Brain showed diffuse subarachnoid hemorrhage.
- **Thorax:** Ribs intact. Lungs congested and edematous.
- **Abdomen:** Stomach contained approximately 100ml of partially digested food. Liver, Spleen, and Kidneys were congested.

V. Opinion Based on the autopsy findings, the deceased appears to have died due to **Craniocerebral Injuries (Head Injuries)** consistent with being struck by a heavy, blunt object (such as a wooden log). All injuries are ante-mortem in nature.

Time Since Death: Approximately 15–18 hours prior to the autopsy.

STATEMENT OF PROSECUTION WITNESSES

STATEMENT OF PW – 1: BROWNE MANI

Under Section 180(3) of BNSS

Statement of Mr. Browne Mani, Aged 43, S/o Whyte Ravi, residing at Ana De Armas Colony, Kuninjipadi, recorded under Section 180(3) BNSS.

Date: April 4, 2026

I reside at the aforementioned address and work as a Painter. I am well-acquainted with the witness Telex Pandian. I also personally know the deceased, Cersei, and her father, Mr. Tywin. I also know the accused, Jamie, who is the husband of the deceased.

On the night of April 3, 2026, at approximately 09:00 P.M., Telex Pandian and I were at the back side of the Kirana Store located on the Dorne Bypass Road, where we were smoking. While there, I observed a well-built man standing hesitantly near the area. Shortly after, Cersei got down from the bus, they began talking. Given that I knew them to be husband and wife, I initially assumed they were having a normal conversation.

Suddenly, I heard a loud noise. When I turned to look, I saw that man, strike Cersei on the back of her head with a wooden log. Before we could shout or reach her, he had already dropped the wooden log and fled the scene. Although it was night, there was a functional street light near the spot, which allowed me to believe that the accused was Jamie, owing to my previous acquaintance with him.

Telex Pandian immediately used his phone to call for an ambulance. While so, I went to inform Cersei's father and her daughter about the attack. Cersei was subsequently transported to the Kuninjipadi Government Hospital with the help of her relatives. Later, we heard that she had passed away at 11:00 P.M. on the same night.



STATEMENT OF PW - 2: TELEX PANDIAN

Under Section 180(3) of BNSS

Statement of Witness Mr. Telex Pandian, Age 42, S/o Late Nesamani, Ana De Armas Colony, Kuninjipadi, recorded under Section 180(3) BNSS.

Date: April 4, 2026

I am an electrician by profession. I personally know the deceased, Cersei, and her father, Mr. Tywin and in fact, her whole family because we all live in same neighborhood. I also know the accused, Jamie, the husband of the deceased, who is said to have issues with the deceased, as a result of which they had been living separately quite a period.

On the night of April 3, 2026, at approximately 09:30 P.M., the other witness and I were together. We were standing at the back side of the Kirana Store located on the bypass road, where we were smoking.

While at that location, I observed a man with a good body built, standing near the bypass road. At that time, Cersie got down from a bus and was walking towards him. The deceased approached him, and they began talking. Suddenly, I witnessed that man strike the deceased on the back of her head with a wooden log. As soon as we both shouted in shock, that man dropped the log and started running away from the scene. Although it was 09:30 P.M. at night, there was reasonable illumination from a nearby street light, which allowed me to identify that man to be Jamie.

The deceased was lying on the ground with bleeding injuries. I immediately called for an ambulance, while Browne Mani informed the family about the attack. She was first taken to the local Government Hospital and she later passed away that night.



STATEMENT OF PW – 3: TYWIN

Under Section 180(3) of BNSS

Statement of Mr. Tywin, Age 65, S/o Manick Baasha, House No. 106, Elder Estate, 11th Main Road, Shadow Glen District, Kuninjipadi, Neverland – 600040, under 180(3) BNSS.

Date: April 4, 2026

I am the father of the deceased, Cersei. Approximately twenty-four years ago, my daughter was residing with me when she became acquainted with the accused, Jamie. Jamie was then employed as a power loom operator in a shed located directly opposite our residence. Despite my strong disapproval and expressed lack of consent, Cersei eloped with the accused to enter into a marriage. From the onset of their marriage, the accused was habitually addicted to alcohol and the use of chewing tobacco, which prevented him from maintaining steady employment or contributing financially to the household. He frequently misappropriated my daughter's earnings and pledged her personal jewelry to fund his addictions.

Due to this continuous domestic instability and the accused's recurring habit of stealing funds, including a significant sum which my daughter had collected in her capacity as a Women's Self-Help Group leader, Cersei eventually left the accused two years ago. She returned to live under my care in Kuninjipadi, along with my grand-daughter, Myrcella. She took up her employment at a garment factory near Kuninjipadi.

On April 3, 2026, I had just returned home from work when Browne Mani and Telex Pandian arrived and informed my wife and me that an incident had occurred involving Cersei near the Dorne Bypass Road. We rushed to the spot promptly and observed a crowd gathered around my daughter, who was in a very serious condition. I observed that my daughter was lying unconscious and was bleeding from her head.

My wife and granddaughter accompanied my daughter in the ambulance to the hospital for emergency treatment. I later received confirmation that my daughter succumbed to her injuries at approximately 11:00 PM that night. I subsequently proceeded to the police station next morning to file the formal complaint.



STATEMENT OF PW – 4: Dr. RAJARAMAN

Under Section 180(3) of BNSS

Statement of Dr. Rajaraman, Civil Assistant Surgeon, Kuninjipadi Government General Hospital.

Date: April 4, 2026

I am serving as a Civil Assistant Surgeon at Kuninjipadi Government General Hospital. On April 4, 2026, I conducted the post-mortem examination on the body of Cersei, aged approximately 40 years, pursuant to a requisition received from Kuninjipadi Rural Police Station.

The body was identified before me by Mr. Tywin, the father of the deceased. The autopsy commenced at 1:30 p.m. and concluded at 2:30 p.m. on April 4, 2026.

Upon external examination, I observed multiple lacerated injuries over the head and left lower limb. The head injuries included lacerations over the forehead, frontal, parietal, parieto-occipital and occipital regions. Several lacerated injuries were also present over the left leg. The injuries showed features of having been sustained during life and were ante-mortem in nature.

Upon internal examination, extensive contusions were noted beneath the scalp corresponding to the external head injuries. A fissured fracture was present in the left parietal bone. The brain showed diffuse subarachnoid hemorrhage. Other internal organs were congested. No injury sufficient to independently cause death was noted in the thorax or abdomen.

In my opinion, the deceased died as a result of craniocerebral injuries sustained to the head. The head injuries were sufficient in the ordinary course of nature to cause death.

The pattern, location and multiplicity of injuries indicate repeated application of force by a hard and blunt object. Such injuries are consistent with assault by a heavy blunt object, including a wooden log or a similar object.

The injuries could not have been caused by a simple fall on a flat surface. The presence of multiple lacerations involving different regions of the scalp, together with the skull fracture and intracranial hemorrhage, suggests repeated impacts rather than a single accidental injury.

Based on the post-mortem findings, the probable time since death was approximately fifteen to eighteen hours prior to the autopsy.

STATEMENT OF PW – 5: BABY KANNAN

Under Section 180(3) of BNSS

Statement of Dr. Baby Kannan, Deputy Director, Forensic Sciences Department, Neverland.

Date: April 30, 2026

I am serving as the Deputy Director of the Forensic Sciences Department, Neverland. On April 20, 2026, our laboratory received certain articles in connection with FIR No. 26/2026 of Kuninjipadi Rural Police Station through C Jung (Head Constable). The articles were received under intact seals, which corresponded with the sample seals forwarded by the investigating agency.

The articles received for examination included blood-stained mud, control mud, a blood-stained wooden log, a yellow and black checked shirt, a saree, a blouse, an in-skirt, and a control blood sample stated to have been obtained from the deceased.

The exhibits were subjected to standard serological examination in accordance with established laboratory procedures. Blood was detected on the blood-stained mud, wooden log, checked shirt, saree, blouse, and in-skirt. No blood was detected on the control mud sample.

Further examination established that the blood detected on the checked shirt, saree, blouse, and in-skirt was of human origin.

The blood group present on the checked shirt, saree, blouse, and in-skirt was determined to be Group 'B'. The control blood sample received from the deceased was also found to belong to Group 'B'.

With regard to the blood-stained mud and the wooden log, although blood was detected, the samples had undergone disintegration. Consequently, the blood group could not be determined from those exhibits.

Based on the examination conducted, the bloodstains detected on the checked shirt and the clothing of the deceased were found to share the same blood group, namely Group 'B'. The control blood sample of the deceased was also Group 'B'.

It is important to note that blood grouping can establish consistency between samples but cannot by itself identify a particular individual as the source of the blood. The results indicate that the blood detected on the examined articles is consistent with the blood group of the deceased.

STATEMENT OF DEFENCE WITNESSES

STATEMENT OF DW - 1: MYRCELLA

Age 17, D/o Jamie, House No. 106, Elder Estate, 11th Main Road, Shadow Glen District,
Kuninjpadi, Neverland – 600040

Date: April 4, 2026

I reside at 106, 11th main road, Kuninjpadi district, Neverland – 600040 with my mother, Cersei. My father, Jamie, is an alcoholic and has been unemployed as far back as I can remember. Due to his addiction, he frequently pledged my mother's jewelry and stole money to fund his drinking. Because of these habits, my parents frequently quarreled. About two years ago, after a major dispute regarding stolen funds, my mother moved us out of our family home to live with my grandparents. Since then, my mother has been working at a garment factory near Kuninjpadi to support us. Because many people in the locality were aware that my mother was living separately from my father, she would occasionally mention that she disliked others taking an unnecessary interest in her personal affairs and preferred to keep family matters private.

A few months before the incident, I remember overhearing a conversation between my mother and my grandfather. My mother appeared upset and told my grandfather that ever since she had started living separately, some men in the locality had begun taking an unwarranted interest in her. She told my grandfather that when she got down from the bus after work, some of them would occasionally follow her for a distance, attempt to initiate conversations, and enquire about her personal life. I remember her telling my grandfather that she was uncomfortable with such attention and wished to be left alone.

On the night of April 3, 2026, at approximately 9:30 PM, I was at home. My mother was returning from her work shift. A person from the locality rushed to our house and informed me that my mother was lying injured near the Dorne Bypass Road bus stop. I immediately rushed to the spot. Upon reaching, I saw my mother in a very serious condition. She was bleeding from an injury on her forehead. I immediately placed a phone call to my father. He arrived at the scene in about 30 mins. We then called for an ambulance (108). My grandmother and I accompanied my mother in the ambulance to the Kuninjpadi Government Hospital. My father also accompanied us. Despite medical efforts, my mother passed away later that night between 11:30 PM and 12:00 AM.



STATEMENT OF DW – 2: TYRION

Statement of Mr. Tyrion, Age 42, S/o Mark Anthony, residing at House No. 12, Lion's Court, Casterly Street, Kuninjipadi, Neverland – 600040.

Date: April 5, 2026

I am the younger brother of Jamie. I have known both Jamie and Cersei throughout their marriage and have remained in close contact with my brother even after they began living separately.

I do not deny that Jamie's drinking habits created serious problems within the family. Over the years, I personally witnessed several arguments between him and Cersei relating to his alcohol addiction and financial difficulties. Their separation was not unexpected to me because the situation had become increasingly difficult for everyone involved.

However, after the separation, I noticed a significant change in Jamie. Earlier, he would spend most of his time drinking and avoiding responsibility. In recent months, he began speaking more seriously about changing his life. I remember one evening in January 2026 when he visited my house after attending a counselling session. He showed me a document relating to his rehabilitation programme and told me that he was trying to remain sober because he did not want Myrcella to remember him only as an alcoholic.

On another occasion, while we were having dinner together, Jamie told me that he regretted the way his addiction had affected his family. He said that if he could not repair his relationship with Cersei, he at least wanted to become someone his daughter could respect. Conversations of this nature became frequent during the months preceding the incident.

I also remember accompanying Jamie to purchase a birthday gift for Myrcella a few weeks before the incident. During that visit, he spoke at length about how much he missed being involved in his daughter's life. He told me that his biggest mistake was allowing alcohol to take priority over his family.

Discussions regarding Jamie and Cersei's future occasionally arose within the family. Jamie remained hopeful that, with time and sustained effort, relations could improve. He never spoke to me about forcing Cersei to return to him. Instead, he would often say that he first needed to prove through his actions that he had changed.

Tywin never had a good opinion of Jamie. Even before the separation, there were disagreements between them. After the separation, whenever Jamie's efforts to improve were discussed, Tywin would usually dismiss them and state that Jamie had already



caused enough damage. This often-discouraged Jamie, but he nevertheless continued with counselling and rehabilitation.

I specifically remember the events of 03.04.2026. At approximately 10:00 PM, I received a phone call from Jamie. He sounded extremely distressed and anxious. During the call, he informed me that Myrcella had just contacted him and informed him that Cersei had sustained serious injuries and had been taken to the hospital.

During our conversation, Jamie informed me that he was travelling by bus to visit our sister in a neighbouring locality. He stated that he had boarded the bus around 8:30 PM that evening and was on his way when he received the call from Myrcella. Apparently, Myrcella informed him that Cersei sustained serious injuries and was lying down near the bust stop in a mere vegetative state. Jamie repeatedly enquired about Cersei's condition and appeared shocked by the information he had received. He informed me that he intended to get down at the next stop and proceed directly to the hospital. I could hear the sound of passengers and the conductor making announcements in the background. Before disconnecting the call, he requested me to keep my phone available in case he required any assistance. The entire conversation lasted for a few minutes. I distinctly remember the call because Jamie rarely telephoned me and he appeared genuinely distressed throughout the conversation.

At approximately 11:00 p.m., Jamie contacted me once again. He was crying and speaking with great difficulty. He informed me that Cersei had been declared dead. During the conversation, he repeatedly lamented that he had wasted several years of his life due to alcoholism and that he had recently been trying to become a better person. I distinctly remember him saying that he had hoped to rebuild his relationship with his daughter and, in time, restore peace within the family. He expressed regret that he would never have the opportunity to make amends to Cersei for the difficulties she had endured during their marriage. The entire incident left him devastated, and I had never heard him speak in such a manner before.



STATEMENT OF DW – 3: SANDOR JACKSON

Statement of Mr. Sandor Jackson, Age 52, Proprietor of Sandor Stores, Dorne Bypass
Road, Kuninjipadi, Neverland – 600040.

Date: April 5, 2026

I am the proprietor of Sandor Stores, a Kirana shop situated near the Dorne Bypass Road bus stop. I have been running this shop for more than twenty years and, owing to the nature of my business, I am familiar with most residents of the locality, including Cersei, her family members, and the accused Jamie.

After Cersei began residing separately from her husband, I would regularly see her passing by my shop while travelling to and from work. She maintained a fairly consistent routine and was generally known in the locality because she travelled through the same route almost every day. Most people knew who she was and were aware that she was living separately with her daughter.

From what I observed, Cersei was a quiet and reserved person. She usually kept to herself and rarely spent time speaking with others in the area. On most occasions, she would either continue walking or briefly purchase household items before returning home.

As is common in smaller neighbourhoods, people often discussed each other's personal affairs. I occasionally overheard residents talking about Cersei's separation from her husband and offering opinions regarding her family situation. From time to time, local residents, particularly men from the locality, would attempt to stop and speak with her while she was passing through the area or after she got down from the bus. Some appeared to be making casual conversation, while others would enquire about her personal circumstances. However, I noticed that Cersei generally preferred not to engage in such conversations and would keep them brief before continuing on her way.

I particularly recall one occasion, a few months before the incident, when a group of local men attempted to involve her in a discussion regarding her family life near my shop. Cersei appeared visibly uncomfortable and remarked that she preferred to keep family matters private. On a few occasions, I also noticed certain individuals walking behind her for some distance after she had alighted from the bus, though I cannot say where they eventually went. After expressing her displeasure, she left the area without continuing the conversation.
